



On Saturday, May 1, dozens of Guadalupe County Master Gardeners will plant a new garden at the Springs Hill Water Corp headquarters at 5510 S. 123 Bypass. The new garden bed will feature recommended low-water use plants for the home landscape and replace more than 2000 sq ft of thirsty turf grass. Springs Hill also will install an 800 gallon rainwater collection cistern and a drip irrigation system as an educational example to homeowners. Pictured is the planning committee, Nancy Masterson, Liz Romero and Clara Mae Marcotte who have planned the garden and prepared the area for Saturday's 8 am planting. More than 130 plants of 26 different varieties will be planted. Paths, plant ID signage, and pecan shell mulch will be installed over the following two weeks.
